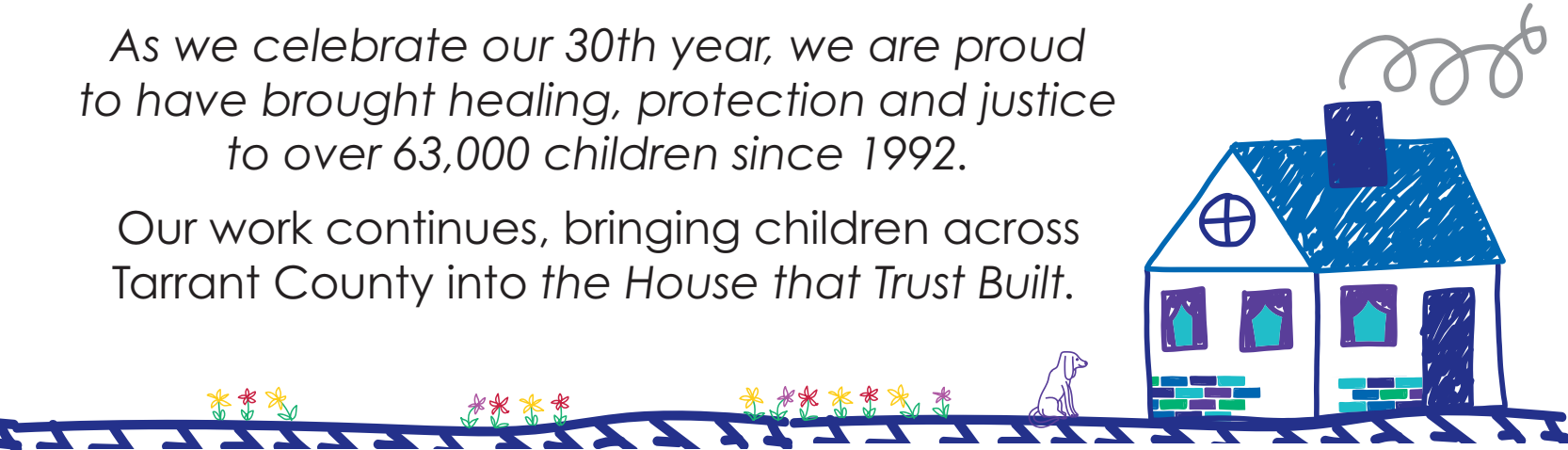




Yesterday, today, and tomorrow, our multidisciplinary team works together to *rescue hope, restore trust, and rebuild the life* of every child we serve.

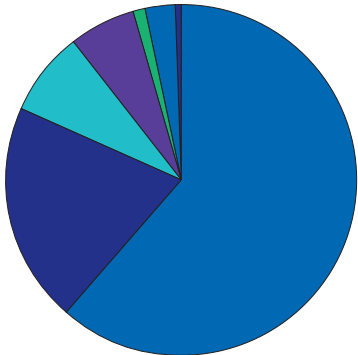

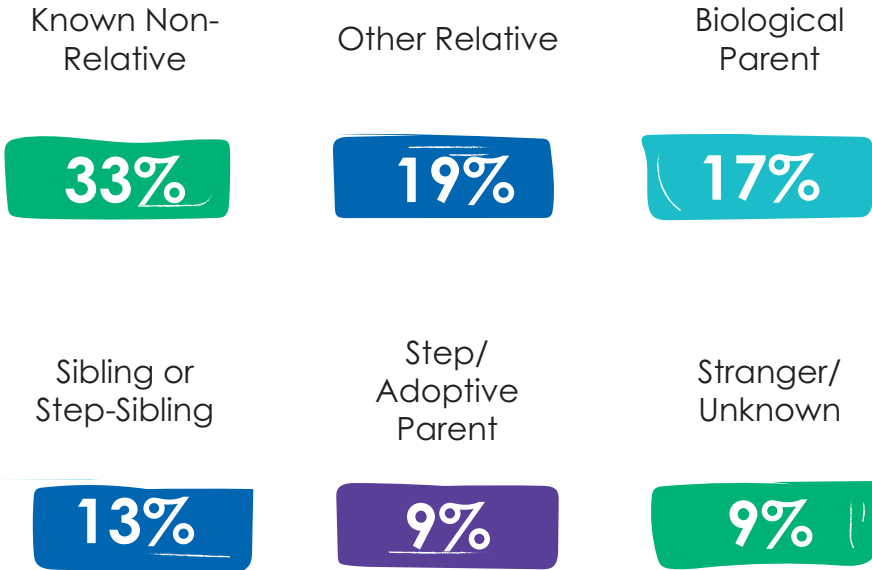
