LETTER FROM PRESIDENT & CEO



Alliance For Children opened its doors in August 1992 in partnership with law enforcement, Child Protective Investigations and the Tarrant County District Attorney's Office with a shared commitment to build a teamed approach to the first responder system when children had been the victim of a crime. Today, more than 74,000 children have walked through our doors as part of an active investigation.

As alleged victims of sexual assault, physical assault, child fatalities, or witnesses of a violent crime, our children have lived immeasurable hardships and trauma in their young lives. Our expert team of professionals has now expanded to include 41 law enforcement agencies and medical professionals providing a personalized, compassionate, and uniquely focused trauma response to 3,296 children and their protective caregivers last fiscal year alone.

Our commitment continues beyond the investigation and criminal court proceedings to a vision of a childhood free from violence. As parents ourselves, we are motivated by a future where less children need the services of Alliance For Children and our multidisciplinary team. Until then, we stand with the children and families that need us for protection, justice and healing.

Thank you for your continued trust in our team and for your gifts of time, talent and treasure to fulfill our goal of rescuing hope, restoring trust and rebuilding lives.

OUR WHY

In a perfect world, we wouldn't exist. There would be no need for a coordinated support system to help children experiencing trauma. But the reality is that over 3,200 children in our area were involved in a child crime investigation last year. That's why our mission is more important than ever: to protect Tarrant County children from child abuse through teamed investigations, healing services, and community education.

We couldn't do our work for child victims without the cooperation and care that comes from our team, our multidisciplinary partners, the leadership of our board, and the generous support of our donors. It takes this kind of committed village to help children rekindle hope in the darkest place.





Helping rebuild a child's life after unimaginable trauma involves expert guidance at every step. Our team-response method is proven to be the best approach for investigations of crimes involving children. Our core services include:

- Our **Multidisciplinary Team Response** ensures children receive needed support by facilitating communication among teams and providing a coordinated approach to our services.
- **Forensic interviews** collect each child's statement through a one-on-one conversation with an expert in speaking to children.
- **Therapy**, offered in a variety of disciplines and modalities at our three locations, assists children on their road to healing.
- **Advocacy** connects the children and their families with the things they need to be safe and healthy, while helping them navigate the course of the investigation.
- Through virtual and in-person classes as well as accessible resources, **community education** equips children to recognize abuse and seek help while empowering adults to recognize, prevent and response effectively to protect children.

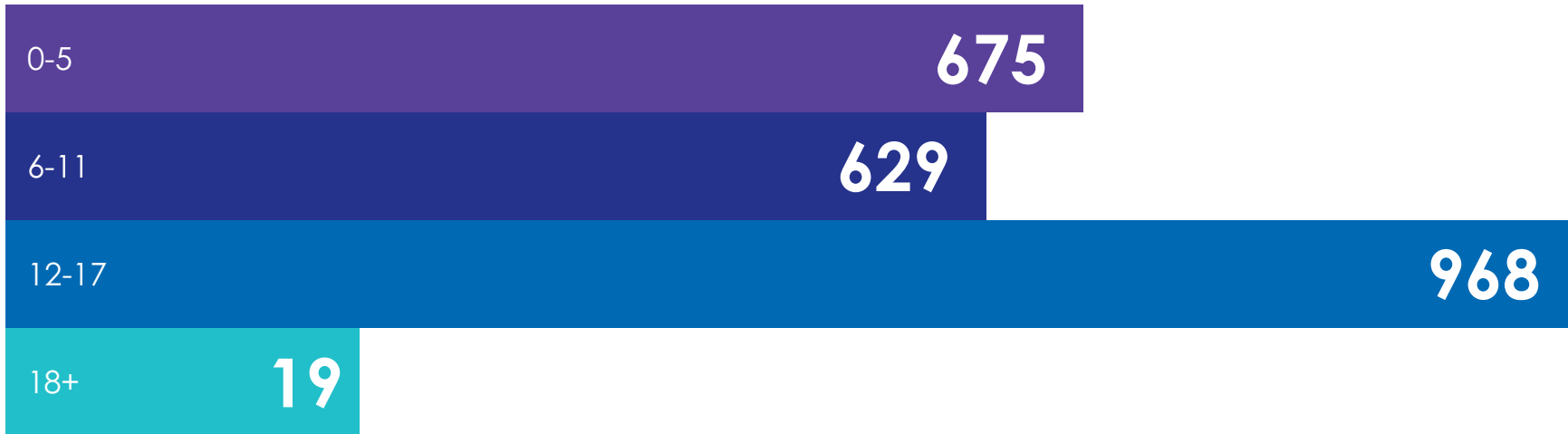

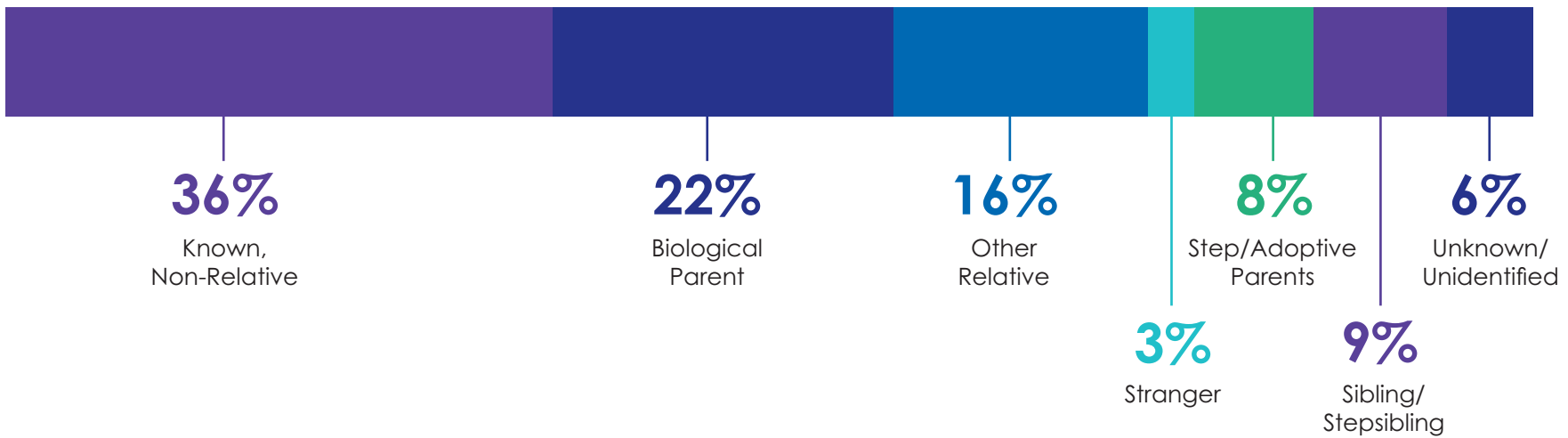

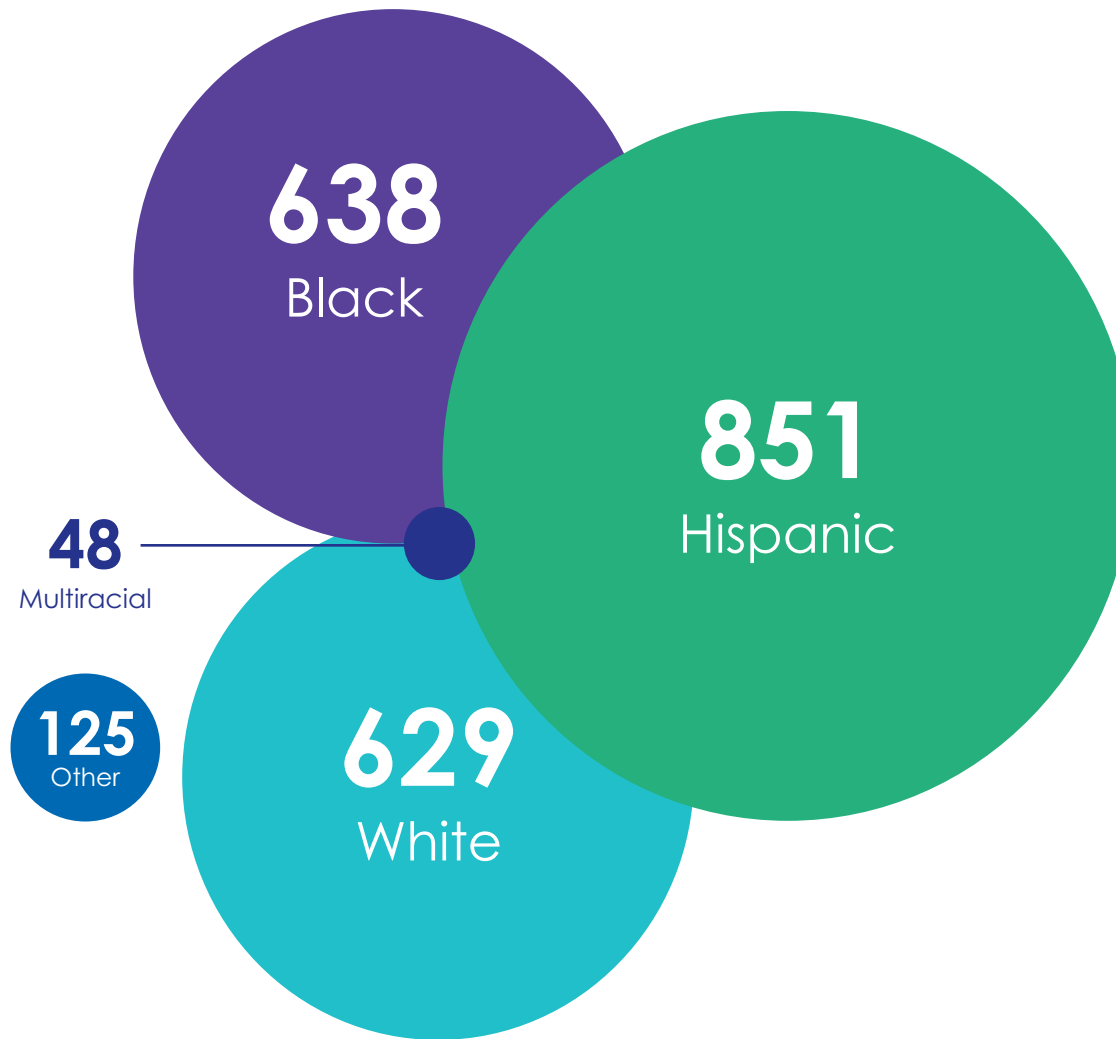


PERPETRATOR'S RELATIONSHIP TO VICTIM

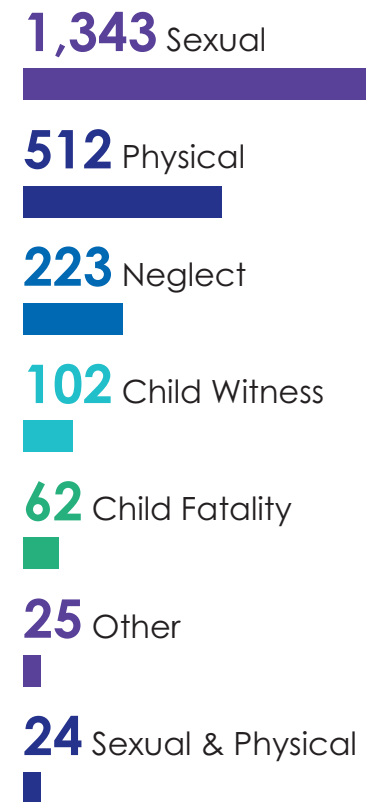
